Best Practice I

SMART

The SMART (Sree Sankara Management Support for Research and Transformation) scheme, initiated by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Sree Sankara College, Kalady in 2019, invites proposals from all the departments every academic year, to provide financial assistance for organizing conference / seminar/ Webinars/ workshop / symposium at international, national, and state level on various subjects of academic relevance. IQAC scrutinizes all the proposals and short list 10 proposals for funding. The scheme continues to encourage the teachers to actively indulge in keeping up with ever-growing research and development activities around the world and to bring pioneers and experts to the campus to interact with the faculty members as well as students. Research scholars are also given an opportunity to

present their research findings. During the pandemic time also, departments kept the spirit up by conducting online programmes with the support of SMART.

Best Practice II

Harithamitra – The Eco-Friendly Club of Sree Sankara College, Kalady

The incessant drive for maintaining the lush green campus of Sree Sankara College eco-friendly, the Bhoomitrasena club, Birds Club International (BCI) and World Wild life Fund (WWF) wing of the college functions hand in hand. All these activities are clubbed together under the umbrella "Harithamitra". In addition to commemorating all the national and international days related with nature and environment, the clubs under Harithamitra conducts competitions for students with a vision to inculcate a sense of environmental sensitivity, energy conservation and responsible citizenship. Distinctiveness of the college

Upholding of Indian Culture and Heritage – Activities of Sanskrit Department

The institution named after the great Saint and philosopher Jagadguru Adi Sankaracharya has the vision to perpetuate his memory and to nurture his birthplace as a cultural citadel with a mission "to mould good citizens with ingenuity, adaptability social commitment and ethical values". The department of Sanskrit is determined to uphold this vision by various activities instilling a sense of nationality among the students.

The institution gives thrust to Advaita Vedanta included in the Sanskrit undergraduate and post graduate programmes. The department publishes a research journal Sadvidya Sanskrit department in association with Thrikkaikkaattu Swamiyar Madom disseminate Indian

philosophy, Sanskrit language, and literature to common man, through weekly contact classes. The department is involved in the conservation of invaluable, palm-leaf manuscripts through digitalisation.

The students of Sanskrit are involved in the activities of Samskrta Bharati – Viswa Samskrta Prathishthanam" a national foundation with international reach for the propagation of Sanskrit and Indian Culture. The department observes Sanskrit Day, Gurupoornima Day and Sankara Jayanthi day every year, to instill the awareness of Indian heritage and values in students. During the previous NAAC peer team visit, special appreciation was rendered to Sanskrit department for their activities. Since 2020, UGC-NSQF approved Diploma Programme, in Yoga Instructor is being conducted by the dept. of Sanskrit in collaboration with Rishi Gurukulam. The faculty members are conducting programmes with financial support from ICPR, ICSSR, etc.

Tree Plantation

Activities of Haritamithra (Bhoomitrasena club, Birds Club International and WWF), NSS and NCC conducts planting of saplings on national and international days of environmental relevance. The volunteers take sincere efforts to maintain the lush green campus of Sree Sankara College. Sree Sankara Campus is having a rich biodiversity, which is responsibly taken care of. The campus which spans over 18 acres of land contains about 742 numbers of trees of about 103 species. Apart from the natural greenery, we have built up:

- Birds club area

Staff and student's collaboration of NSS, Bhoomithrasena is held responsible for maintenance of greenery inculcating a sustainable culture among the student's community.

Alternate Energy initiatives

The college auditorium, college library and many of the classrooms are equipped with energy saving appliances. Newly installed as well as repaired lights are all LED based. Green, energy and environmental audits were conducted and steps are planned to regulate the energy usage of the campus eco-friendly.

Energy Conservation initiatives

Green, energy and environmental audits were conducted and steps are planned to regulate the energy usage of the campus eco-friendly.

Bhoomitrasena ensures students as well as staff are aware of the need of energy conservation by conducting various competitions, placing notices in classrooms on switching off lights and fans when not in need, etc. Public awareness is also taken care of by doing marches, awareness programs, etc.

Rain Water Harvesting

The campus has a rain water harvesting system of 25 lakhs litre capacity. The facility is shared with sister concern campus also. The rainwater is collected through PVC pipes leading to the Rain water collection tank installed in the college campus.

Waste Management

BIODEGRADABE WASTE:

Biogas Plant:

The biodegradable wastes are mainly collected from the college canteen and deposited into the 1 m³ FRP Biogas plant installed near the canteen kitchen.

Vermi Compost:

The major source of raw material for vermi-compost is the leaves in the college campus and also the wastes generated which are not fed into biogas. The vermi-compost plant is installed near the scrap yard in the college campus.

NON-BIODEGRADABLE WASTE:

Incinerator:

The incinerator is used for incinerating non-biodegradable wastes such as paper, plastic, used sanitary napkins, etc. The ash generated is used as manure after mixing with cow dung for plants. The ash generated from plastic will be treated separately. The ash generated from canteen where wood is used as a fuel is used as manure for plants. The college campus is promoting biodegradable packaging and reducing the consumption of plastic to a large extent.

LABORATORY WASTE:

The acids alkalis are to be disposed by wash down procedure by using excess water after maintaining its pH value. In Sree Sankara college ample ventilation is given in all laboratory.

ELECTRONIC WASTE:

Our college has signed an MoU with Al Ameen Industries, South Vazhakkulam, Ernakulam, which is registered with Kerala pollution Control Board for regular management & disposal of all the e-wastes to protect the environment.

Plastic free Initiatives

The Bhoomitrasena Club has signed MoU for plastic waste management with with Hamara Plastics, Aimiry Koovappady. Plastic waste bins are placed at various corners of the campus. Classes for making paper pens, paper bags, jute bags are conducted by Bhoomitrasena club, NSS and NCC. Usage of non-plastic carry bags are also promoted.

Promoting Public transporting

Majority of students ply to the campus using public transport system. A handful of students as well as staff use bicycles. Many teachers indulge in car pooling for commuting to college. Our campus has built up a well-designed pedestrian friendly pathway without disturbing the natural beauty of our campus. Students can easily access all the blocks using these pedestrian friendly pathways.
