
Exploring the creative potential of graduate students in start-ups and funding Opportunity

ENERGY CONSERVATION DAY



Every year, on December 14th Energy Conservation Day is being commemorated world over. It is aimed at raising awareness about energy usage, ensuring the affordability of safe and sustainable energy for all people while targeting carbon emission reduction. The true meaning of energy conservation is to avoid unnecessary use of energy and to use at least power so that energy sources can be saved for future uses. To make energy conservation plans more effective, every person should include energy conservation in their behaviour. Bhoomitrasena Club of Sree Sankara College took the true spirit of Energy conservation & celebrated the Energy Conservation Day on 15th December 2023 with diverse programmes. The one-day programme was charted as follows: In the Forenoon session two talks by eminent experts in the focal area and an Energy Literacy quiz in the afternoon. The programme started at 10.30 am with evoking the God's presence through the prayer by Janaky S Kurup and Anamika S of II DC Zoology. Programme Coordinator Dr. Mini K D welcomed the gathering. Principal Dr. Preethi Nair inaugurated the program and stressed the significance of celebrating such environmentally relevant days. The session started at 10.45 am by Sri. Sijo George, Associate Professor, EEE, ASIET Kalady. We were lucky to have very apt person to take the class as he is the Resource Person of Energy Management Centre

Kerala. He spoke on the topic 'Energy Conservation & Energy Efficiency' and explained well the differences between energy conservation and energy efficiency. EE and EC measures can help to directly lower energy costs for consumers and potentially reduce greenhouse gas emissions associated with energy use. Consumers also benefit indirectly when reducing their electricity demand helps to reduce costs of electricity generation, transmission, and distribution. High electricity demand often results in higher costs for power generation and electricity transmission, which are passed on to customers in their utility bills. The second session was at 11.50 pm which was led by Sri. Azeem K. Senior Consultant, Alenzo Energy Pvt. Ltd. on the topic; Home Energy Audit. It was really an important topic of practical application. Energy auditing will help consumers to (i) map energy usage in their households, (ii) conserve energy, (iii) improve energy efficiency and thereby (iv) maximize their household energy and cost savings. Students raised their doubts regarding the method of auditing which was cleared by the resource person. The class was ended up at 1.30 pm for lunch. Afternoon session was planned to engage with the Energy Literacy Quiz. 12 teams of 2 students each were enrolled for the quiz. A preliminary round of screening test was conducted to select the teams for final round. 4 teams were chosen for the final round competition. Dr. Sinitha Dr. Anumol and Dr. Manju the faculty members of BMC led the quiz. It was really interesting and all the contestants participated actively. The I year M.Sc. Students of Environmental science department secured the first prize followed by the students of II year Zoology (II Prize) and Physics department got the Third prize. The winners were given the prizes.


• Anti-Drug Pledge

Akshara R Nair, LLM (Student), Inter University Centre for IPR Studies, CUSAT, On 16 August 2023, Honourable Chief justice of India D Y Chandrachud released a Handbook on Combating Gender Stereotypes to be used by judges and legal community. This handbook is a guide to gender just language. It encourages the use of gender neutral language that avoids patriarchal stereotypes which have been used for decades. It also includes a sub-chapter on gender fluidity and discusses harmful stereotypes that can exist with respect to any gender identity. ENVIRONMENT AWARENESS PROGRAMMES



NALLONAM








COUNSELLING SESSION: TOXIC RELATIONSHIPS




