15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Being an affiliated college, our course structure and the content for pedagogical transaction is designed by the parent university (Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam) as per the UGC guidelines. The University has an 'Open Course' which is an optional course, of which the student is free to take at his/her will. The Open course which is offered in the fifth semester is a non-major elective course offered by the Departments other than the parent department. The University offers a flexible and innovative curricula that includes credit-based courses and projects in the areas of community engagement and service, environmental education, and value based towards the attainment of a holistic and multidisciplinary education. The students of every discipline have a core paper in Environmental Studies and Human Rights in the fifth semester. Many of the elective papers especially in the language disciplines, offered at the UG and PG levels address issues of Ethics, Gender sensitivity and Indian Values. The elective courses offered by Science disciplines include cross cutting research areas including material science, Nanosciences, etc. The institution has also implemented multiple Add on programmes for the fruitful implementation of multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary education which will definitely enable our students to develop the skills required in 21st century.. The Add On courses have been chosen by each department with learning outcomes that define the specific knowledge, skills, attitudes and values that are to be acquired by the learner and would ensure that each programme achieves its goal of being interdisciplinary and at the same time help the student in his/her chosen career field. The B. Voc Programmes offered by the institution have a suitable mix of general education and skill development components and also have multiple exits at the end of 1st, 2nd and 3rd years of undergraduate education while maintaining the rigor of learning.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

As part of the institution's commitment to aligning with the National Education Policy (NEP) standards, all students at Sree Sankara College, Kalady, have successfully registered on the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) portal and obtained their unique APAAR/ABC IDs. From the 2024 admission cycle onward, it has been made mandatory for students to register for an ABC ID, as Mahatma Gandhi University, the affiliating university, has transitioned to NEP standards. Additionally, a significant number of students have utilized their ABC IDs to register on the SWAYAM portal, successfully completing several courses and thereby earning valuable credit points that contribute to their Academic Bank of Credits. To support this initiative, the college has set up a dedicated help-desk to assist students in resolving any technical issues encountered during the registration process, ensuring smooth implementation and maximum participation.

17.Skill development:

Skill Enhancement Initiatives and Programmes The college offered four UGC-NSQF approved certificate programmes, four diploma programmes, and twenty add-on courses, aimed at equipping students with skills for meaningful participation in India's economic growth. These initiatives prepare students for employment, foster entrepreneurship, and promote knowledge creation. The institution also provides programmes in Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Microbiology, and Environmental Science, incorporating skill development components tailored for diverse employment opportunities in education, healthcare, manufacturing, and other service sectors. Additionally, the UGC has sanctioned the establishment of Deen Dayal Kaushal Kendra, a dedicated centre for enhancing skilled human abilities and livelihood development at Sree Sankara College. 18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Appropriate Integration of Indian Knowledge System The institution has taken significant strides to integrate the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) into its academic framework, aligning with the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. This approach seeks to incorporate India's rich heritage of knowledge and philosophy into modern education, fostering a deeper understanding of traditional practices and their contemporary relevance. Teaching Indian Knowledge Systems Curricular Offerings: The college offers courses that align with the NEP 2020's emphasis on the indigenous knowledge system. These include: UGC-NSOF Skill-Based Programme: One-year Diploma Course in Yoga Instructor (Level 5) for students within and outside the campus. Certificate Programme: Desktop Publishing in Sanskrit. Add-On Courses: Vrikshayurveda Jyotirvijnanam Content Writing and Journalism Technical Literature in Sanskrit Vedic Mathematics Vaastu Shastra for practitioners. These courses sensitively

integrate traditional Indian practices with modern pedagogy, enabling students to gain insight into classical traditions and their application in fields like Science, Mathematics, Medicine, and Architecture. Bridge Course: A specialized course to develop language skills for first-year students, encouraging proficiency in Sanskrit. Cultural Enrichment and Research Initiatives The Sanskrit department offers traditional training to sensitize students to classical traditions and practices, fostering an insider's perspective of Indian civilization. Programmes like Vakyarthasadas, conducted on every full moon day, facilitate discussions on Vedanta, Nyaya, Vyakarana, and Sahitya, promoting critical thinking and original thought. Workshops on diverse subjects like NLP, Ayurveda, Natya Sastra, and Vaastu Sastra help students explore the breadth of Indian knowledge traditions. Resources and Collaboration Learning Resources: The institution houses a robust Sanskrit library, with over 6,000 volumes, including rare books on Vedabhashyas, Vaastu Sastra, and Ayurveda. Continuous additions ensure the enrichment of these resources. Collaboration: The institution partnered with the Institute for the Advancement of Vedic Mathematics (IAVM) to organize an International Conference on Vedic Mathematics. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with IAVM has led to the introduction of a Vedic Mathematics course for undergraduates. Online Courses and Skill Development Online courses and training programs in Sanskrit communication skills (e.g., Samskrta Sambhashana Sibiram) have been launched to improve accessibility to the Indian Knowledge System. Skill development components embedded in courses like Biochemistry, Biotechnology, and Microbiology are aligned with IKS to provide employment-ready skills in sectors like healthcare and manufacturing. Awards and Recognition The department was honored with the 'Dr. Sulochana M Goel' Award for young scholars at the 23rd WAVES India Conference, New Delhi, in December 2019. Manuscript Preservation and Scientific Knowledge The department conducts training programs on manuscript preservation, ensuring the survival and accessibility of ancient Indian knowledge. National and international seminars delve into the extensive scientific knowledge embedded in Sanskrit literature, further fostering a research-oriented approach to IKS. Through these efforts, the institution exemplifies how traditional Indian knowledge systems can be effectively integrated into modern education, ensuring the preservation, dissemination, and practical application of this invaluable heritage.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The institution places a significant emphasis on Outcome-Based Education (OBE) to ensure that students develop essential skills, knowledge, and competencies in alignment with industry-specific goals and global standards. Curriculum Design and Flexibility All programmes offered by the college, affiliated with Mahatma Gandhi University, follow the CBCS (Choice Based Credit Semester) system with an Outcome-Based Approach. The curriculum is designed with the flexibility to integrate the latest advancements, stimulating students' creativity while addressing industry requirements. Programmes are structured with clearly defined Programme Outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs), and Course Outcomes (COs) to guide student learning effectively. Evaluation and Assessment The college employs a robust continuous assessment mechanism, utilizing grade point averages for evaluation. Internal assessments are designed using the six cognitive domains of Revised Bloom's Taxonomy, ensuring questions align with different levels of learning-from basic knowledge recall to critical analysis and creation. The university sets question papers based on the cognitive levels defined by Bloom's Taxonomy, and the college has committed to conducting at least one internal assessment adhering to these OBE standards. Faculty Development and Training Faculty members are encouraged to participate in Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs), short-term courses, and seminars to enhance their proficiency in the OBE approach. The institution organizes in-house FDPs to foster skill development in this area. Notable examples include: Art of Framing Questions: Applying Bloom's Taxonomy. Outcome-Based Education: Framing Questions Using Bloom's Taxonomy. Both programmes were conducted with financial support from the UGC-MHRD-STRIDE scheme in collaboration with Mahatma Gandhi University, benefiting over 100 teachers statewide in addition to the college's faculty. Learning Outcomes and Opportunities The focus on OBE ensures the development of analytical skills and effective communication abilities among students. The college fosters a learning environment where students are empowered to achieve essential outcomes, bridging the gap between academic learning and practical application. Commitment to Excellence Through its dedication to the OBE framework, the institution ensures that students are prepared to meet professional and societal challenges, making them competent and confident contributors to their respective fields. The integration of Bloom's Taxonomy, FDPs, and structured outcomes reflects the institution's commitment to quality education and continuous improvement.

20.Distance education/online education:

The institution has embraced modern technology to create a robust distance and online education ecosystem, ensuring quality learning opportunities for students. The College has implemented a Learning Management System (LMS), viz. Linways and a Student Management System (SMS) across all programmes to provide a seamless online teaching-learning environment. A blended learning approach integrates online and offline methods, allowing for continuous monitoring and timely interventions to address student needs. Extra classes and remedial sessions are conducted online to support students, with faculty utilizing tools such as Google Classroom, Google Meet, and Microsoft Teams to deliver content. Learning materials, including audio lectures, videos, and PPTs, are regularly uploaded to the college's YouTube channel and digital classrooms for easy access. Students and faculty actively participate in Swayam MOOCs and NPTEL courses, coordinated by a dedicated faculty member. These efforts are complemented by professional development initiatives for teachers to enhance their online teaching skills. The institution's focus on distance and online education ensures accessibility, continuous learning, and skill enhancement, creating an inclusive and engaging academic environment.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

As per the guidelines of University, Principal appointed an Internal Exam Committee for the conduct of transparent and robust Examinations and to make policy decisions thereof. The Committee in consultation with the principal prepares schedule for internal examination, and is included in the academic calendar. Exams are conducted in a Centralised mode and time tables are displayed on the notice board. Teachers in charge prepare question papers for each theory course. To maintain transparency and uniformity in the assessment of the internal tests, the faculty evaluates the papers within a week of conduction of test. The evaluated answer sheets are returned to students for grievances, if any. All mark lists are submitted to the internal Examination committee for record. The final internal assessment marks calculated on the basis of attendance, marks of class test and assignment marks, and are uploaded on university portal at the end of semester. The consolidated marklist is published in the notice board and grievances are redressed before uploading the same to the university portal. Absentees, if genuine reason is presented, are given retest.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

Internal Examinations are conducted centrally by the internal exam committee based on the norms of the University. Once the results are ready, the departments publish it on notice board as well as in Class WhatsApp groups. A time period of maximum two days is fixed for submission and redressal of grievances if any, is given for all students. In case of grievances, the teacher in charge of the course will redress it by doing the needful. In case a student could not appear for an exam based on genuine reasons, he/she is given another chance to do it within one week's time. Grievances on other components of Internal assessment such as assignments, attendance, etc are also redressed effectively and time bound. Assignment submissions and seminars, if not done within the stipulated time, date will be extended but with a proportionate reduction in grade. Attendance shortages, if reported are dealt with based on the regulations put forth by the University. Exam related grievances if not regressed by the teacher-in-charge, will be forwarded to Student Grievance Redressal Committee of the

institute. Then, grievance committee with the guidance of the principal will take over the matter and start redressal mechanisms at the earliest.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 Infrastructure and Physical Facilities for Teaching-Learning

The institution has robust infrastructure and adequate facilities to support effective teaching-learning processes. A dedicated planning committee oversees the evaluation and augmentation of infrastructure.

Classroom Facilities: The campus has 94 Wi-Fi-enabled classrooms, of which 40 are ICT-enabled, ensuring seamless integration of technology in teaching. Classrooms are spacious, well-ventilated, and equipped with modern furniture. The major facilities include one auditorium with a capacity of 1500, a seminar hall (200 seating), a mini-seminar hall (50 seating), two conference rooms, and a recording studio. Faculty rooms are available for all departments, along with laptops, desktops, and printers.

Laboratories and Equipment: The college has 34 laboratories supporting UG, PG, and research programs, equipped with advanced instruments like the RF Magnetron Sputtering Unit, UV-Vis Spectrophotometer, FT-IR Spectrometer, and more.

Computing and Academic Resources: Six computer labs with 233 computers cater to academic and administrative needs. Other facilities include a digital library, department libraries, a counseling center, and exclusive spaces for cells and clubs like NCC, NSS, and the Entrepreneurship Development Club.

Additional Amenities: The campus spans 18 acres and features a botanical garden, herbal garden, canteen, gymnasium, indoor

stadium, hostel for girls, and rainwater harvesting with a 16,00,000-liter capacity. Sports facilities include courts for basketball and volleyball, a multipurpose playground, and a shooting center.

Sree Sankara College Library, renamed as Sri Abhinava Vidya Theertha Learning Resource Centre, is fully automated using the Koha ILMS (version 22.11.07). Automation, initiated in 2021, streamlines library operations such as circulation, cataloging, and OPAC searches, significantly enhancing user experience. Through WebOPAC, users can remotely search, reserve, and renew books. SMS and email alert services provide timely notifications regarding due dates and reservations.

The library employs an open-access system, with books systematically arranged using the Dewey Decimal Classification. Its digital library is managed through DSpace software, offering access to institutional repositories and subscribed e-resources like e-books and e-journals via platforms such as NLIST. A unique feature of the library is its support for differently-abled users, including the production of audiobooks by library club volunteers.

Additional digital initiatives include an e-gate register for visitor tracking and the IRINS portal for showcasing faculty research. The library fosters academic and cultural engagement with features like "Authorial," a rare collection of author-signed books, and programs such as newsletters, exhibitions, and user orientation. This automation reflects the library's commitment to providing efficient, inclusive, and technologically advanced services to its stakeholders.

Solid waste management: As an initiative of Bhoomitrasena Club, the institution has installed a biogas plant to process the biodegradable wastes.

Vermicomposting is carried out for efficient solid waste management. Of the biodegradable waste generated, about 50% is used in biogas plant and the rest is composted/used in vegetable garden. Bhoomitrasena Club, has placed waste bins at various corners in the campus, to collect plastic and other non-degradable waste. These plastic waste is collected by the Panchayat under the Haritha Kerala Mission.

Sree Sankara College has a valid MOU signed with Northamps Global Ecosolutions Private Limiged during the year 2023-24.Northamps Global Ecosolution Privte Limiteda non-governmental Organisation conducted classes on waste management.

Liquid waste management: Underground sewage disposal pits are constructed. Liquid waste from chemistry lab are drained to sewage pits after safety monitoring. The liquid waste from Lifesciences lab are autoclaved and drained.

E-waste management: E-waste at present is collected from all the departments and handed over to e waste managemet teams from time to time.

Biomedical Waste Management:Biomedical waste such as clinical specimens, soiled swabs, and microbial cultures is autoclaved to eliminate pathogens before safe disposal into landfills. Glass slides are treated with sodium hypochlorite and autoclaved, while a syringe incinerator is used to safely burn syringes used for blood collection.

Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management:Chemical waste is segregated, treated, and disposed of responsibly, while biological waste is sterilized through autoclaving to prevent contamination, ensuring sustainable and compliant laboratory practices across all departments.

Best Practice 1: SMART (Sree Sankara Management Aid for Research and Transformation)
